Activity Description

Interactive workshop focused on topical areas of research and practice in cutaneous lymphoma. The aim of the workshop is to review the current state and to pave the road to the new developments in the basic, translational and clinical research in cutaneous lymphomas and other lymphoproliferative disorders.

Our topic this year is: *Frontiers in Precision Medicine and Cancer Registry in Cutaneous Lymphoma*

Genomic and proteomic testing is rapidly becoming a compass in the practice of precision medicine. This workshop will help participants distinguish and more accurately interpret genomic and proteomic testing methods used in the evaluation of cancer tissue. In 2017 the USCLC will launch the first U.S. registry for cutaneous lymphomas. This workshop will help participants discriminate subtle differences in clinical and laboratory findings that may impact staging of patients with CTCL. In addition, attendees will be able to construct a plan to implement the power of the USCLC registry into their clinical workflow. As in 2016, the USCLC workshop we will use audience response devices to engage the physicians.

Target Audience

Dermatologists, medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, pathologists, transplantation specialists, and other clinicians who are involved in the diagnosis and treatment of patients with the cutaneous manifestations of cutaneous T-cell lymphoma.
